#### **CAN YOU HELP?**

Case # 48 –Tanya found two female Pit Bull mix puppies dumped by a creek. They are both six months old now and Tanya just recently was laid off from her job. She is also a single parent of two. She is on Medicaid and food stamps and receives no child support. SNAP's cost to get them done is \$160.

Case #49-Bonnie had a stray dog show up. It is approximately two years old and is a boxer mix. Being in a wheelchair, Bonnie had not considered having a pet, but Daisy stays by her side and has been a great comfort. She is so excited to be able to get Daisy spayed. SNAP's cost is \$80.

Case #50-John lives north of Springfield on a very low income. He has twelve stray cats and two stray dogs that he has been feeding. He does want the animals to go to a shelter but knows he needs to spay and neuter for them to stay. He can't afford any of the cost so SNAP will need to pay the full amount of \$630 to fix four male cats, six female cats and two large male dogs.

If you are able to help fix any of these animals, please send your donation to SNAP, PO Box 14354, Springfield, MO 65814. No amount is too small. It all adds up to do great things! You can specify which case you would like to contribute to. In the event the case you specify has already been helped by another caring donor, your contribution will be used to help a different but equally in-need pet owner. Thank you for your support!
