Case # 7 – Ruth is a single grandparent raising her disabled grandson. Their only income is a disability check. She picked up a female Shih-Tzu mix at the nearby Wal-Mart. They would love to keep her but can't afford to spay her. The cost to fix Misty is \$55.00.

Case #8 – Beth lives just outside Springfield, MO. She was given a female Pit-bull that has now had two litters. She kept one of the puppies who is now 3 months old. She heard about us at the food pantry and would like to get both dogs spayed but has no money to put toward it. The cost to get both dogs fixed is \$140.00.

Case #9 – Katie lives east of Springfield and had two female cats show up pregnant. The mamas left as soon as the kittens were weaned so Katie now has ten 3-4 month old kittens to fix. With a monthly income of under \$1000/month, it's a struggle. She has spayed the 2 female kittens already thru SNAP but needs help with 8 males. Total cost for the 8 males is \$240.

If you are able to help fix any of these animals, please send your donation to SNAP, PO Box 14354, Springfield, MO 65814. You can specify on the memo line which case you would like to help. In the event the case you specify has already been helped by another caring donor, your contribution will be used to help a different but equally in-need pet owner as determined by the SNAP team.
