Case # 66 —Nancy had a pregnant stray cat show up at her house. The three kittens are now three months old and she would like to get the mother and kittens fixed so she can keep them. She also has a one year old male Shepherd/Lab mix that needs to be done. She lives by herself on a fixed income and the animals give her lots of love and enjoyment. SNAP's cost to get them done is \$265.

Case #67-Kevin had two male dogs show up about a year ago, an adult lab and a younger Border Collie/Pit mix. He has been caring for the dogs then a female Husky showed up. He is scared she will get pregnant and would love to have all of them fixed. He has been laid off and is currently looking for work. The cost to fix all three dogs is \$240.

Case #68-Sarah rescued two male dogs from a bad situation. One is a year old Pit Bull and the other is a five year old Hound mix. The family of four is on food stamps and can give both dogs a good home but needs help with the neutering. SNAP's cost to have both dogs fixed is \$180.

You can specify which case you would like to contribute to.
