Human Peeves

Have you ever wondered what "human" peeves our furry friends might have about us? Here are a few to ponder.

- Having inconsistent rules and boundaries Dogs
 thrive on consistency and routine, and take comfort in
 it. If your pup is allowed on the couch one week, then
 scolded for it the next, she will become stressed when
 she can't anticipate your reaction to her behavior. She
 won't understand if one night you decide to "let it
 slide" or you allow her to break the rules for a "special
 occasion." When you create boundaries, stick to
 them!
- Staring at a dog you don't know There is a
 difference between the loving gazes shared between
 a dog and her family members and a dog that's being
 stared down by a stranger. If you meet a new dog, try
 to avoid eye contact as he is getting to know you.
 Some dogs will consider extended eye contact from a
 stranger to be a challenge which will increase their
 stress response.
- Overly aggressive petting When it comes to petting, many cats prefer a light touch. Petting too aggressively can over-stimulate your cat and invariably lead to you getting scratched or bitten since that's the only way he can tell you to knock it off.
 When petting your cat, observe his body language carefully and stop if you see tail flicking, ears curled back and other signs of displeasure.

Case #92- Nicholas has been unable to find work for the last several months. He has a cat and two dogs that need to be neutered. Two of the animals were strays and one came from a family member. It will cost \$195 to have these animals fixed.
