
Cool Off This Summer at SNAP's 2nd Annual

How Can You Help? Sponsor a Spay!

Nearly a year ago we *unleashed* our Sponsor-A-Spay program. Since then, your generous donations have funded more than 120 spays and neuters ("speuters") for needy pet owners. We've had great success, but as SNAP becomes more well-known (which is what we want), our waiting list keeps growing and now stands at 101 pets!

We've got everything from A to Z (Angel, a gray cat, and Ziggy, an orange cat), from cat to dog (Hope, 9-month old gray & white, to Missie, a brindle pit bull), from young to old (Baby, a 6-month-old chow/shepherd mix to Cassy, a 6-year-old white pom/spitz mix),

from Chihuahuas to Collies (Paco to TAZ), and everything in between: all shapes, sizes, colors and political affiliations (just kidding, because that's yet another wonderful trait of our four-legged



friends...they don't care about our politics!).

We are looking for donors to dig deep for some dough before these 101 pets quickly become 1,001 unwanted homeless animals. Our waiting list includes 23 dogs (13 are females) and 78 cats (26 are females). Fixing these Free-Lovin' Felines and Casanova Canines will greatly reduce future pet overpopulation in the Ozarks.

Alert! Alert! Important Medical Warning!!!

We are including a synopsis of an article from the Alburtis Animal Hospital written by veterinarian Dr. Donovan for their March 20, 2004 newsletter. The article has been reviewed and its content confirmed by a local vet. We pass on this important information to make sure you do *not* administer Kaopectate®, which is newly formulated and now potentially lethal, to your feline

friends. As always, please check with your veterinarian!

In the past, many veterinarians have told their customers to administer a small dose of Kaopectate® when their cats are experiencing gastro-intestinal problems. However, the "New & Improved" Kaopectate® now includes an aspirin derivative that can be <u>toxic to cats</u> in amounts formerly recommended by veterinarians.

To summarize, aspirin, Tylenol, Pepto Bismol, and now Kaopectate® must <u>never</u> be given to cats without consulting your veterinarian. Some dogs, too, can be sensitive to aspirin and its derivatives. For more information on preventing and treating poisonings, visit the ASPCA's Poison Control Center website at www.apcc.aspca.org.

Ever wonder what the top ten North American dog names are...and what they mean?


- 1. Sam/Samantha/Sammie: From Hebrew meaning "the listener."
